BRISTOL – The Main Street Community Foundation is currently accepting scholarship applications from local students.

Samantha Rajotte, Scholarship & Program Officer at the Main Street Community Foundation said that the Main Street Community Foundation is currently accepting scholarship applications for more than 80 different funds.

"There is \$275,000 available this year," she said. "The deadline to apply is March 11."

The scholarships are available to graduating seniors, current college students and adults returning to school who are or will be attending two or four year colleges. There are also scholarships for technical schools and career certification programs.

Additionally, Rajotte said that there are also a few scholarships available for students attending elementary and secondary private schools in Bristol.

"The majority of scholarships are open to residents of Bristol, Burlington, Plainville, Plymouth, Southington and Wolcott who are graduating high school seniors, current college students or adults returning to school," said Rajotte.

Each scholarship has unique eligibility criteria established by the donor.

"Donors are individuals, families, businesses or other organizations that seek to assist students in pursuing their education and career goals and dreams," said Rajotte. "They have a belief that helping students ease the financial obligations of education is an investment in the future."
