The Bristol Farmers Market will hold open for its 2025 year this morning at 10 Main St. from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Also, on Memorial Boulevard, the 3rd annual Family Fun Day will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Other events happening today include the last day of the Bristol Scavenger Hunt and LB3 performing at the New Cambridge Project.

The Bristol Farmers Market will run every Saturday, beginning today, through Oct. 4 with its Fall Festival scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 15.

The Bristol Farmers Market is a CT-Grown market. The Connecticut Grown Program was developed by the state Department of Agriculture in 1986, when the now-familiar green and blue logo was created to identify agricultural products grown in the state.

Over the past three decades, the Connecticut Grown Program has blossomed into a multifaceted initiative targeting diverse local, regional, national and international markets through both direct-to-consumer and wholesale-oriented program components.

Also, today, the 3rd Annual Family Fun Day will be held on Memorial Boulevard, begins at 11 a.m. and continues through the early afternoon. Also at New Cambridge project, following the close of the scavenger hunt, a special show features local band LB3 with added attractions, including food truck and craft beers.
