

A Hometown Celebration Marks 30 Years!

In celebration of its 30th anniversary, Main Street Community Foundation (MSCF) welcomed a sold-out crowd of 380 quests to The Main Event 30th Anniversary Celebration - Meet Us On Main Street at the Aqua Turf Club on September 13, 2025. The night



featured a variety of roaming entertainment, live and silent auctions, delicious food, and a memorable celebration of the history of the Foundation and its Founders.

\$30,000 Awarded to Local Nonprofits

The Main Event featured a special "You Be the Grantmaker" program in which the attendees participated in the selection of ten grants, totaling \$30,000, to ten local nonprofit organizations. These finalists were chosen from an applicant pool that answered the prompt "Our organization will make a difference in the next 30 years because we will..." All ten of these organizations do incredible work in our communities but only one walked away from the event with the top grant of \$10,000.

Loud cheers erupted when it was announced that the recipient of the \$10,000 Circa 1995 Grant was Southington Community Cultural Arts and Diann Thomson accepted the big check.

Nonprofit Education Workshop Builds Strength in Uncertain Times

Nonprofit organizations continually have to adapt to new challenges and opportunities during these every-

changing times. To assist organizations in reviewing the current political landscape and its effect on the industry, Main Street Community Foundation partnered with Pro Bono Partnership to offer a workshop, "How Nonprofits Can Strengthen their Governance and Operations During a Time of Uncertainty." Executive Directors, board members, and senior staff members from 20 local organizations attended

this interactive session that focused on what they can proactively do to build strength in the face of external pressures, with an emphasis on board governance and human resources and operations. Sara Taylor, Senior Staf


