Scholarships available for Burlington students

BURLINGTON — Main Street Community Foundation is now accepting scholarship applications for the 2021-22 academic year. A full list of scholarships available, their eligibility criteria and links to the online applications are available on the Foundation website, mainstreetfoundation.org.

A total of \$260,000 in scholarships will be awarded from 80 different funds this year.
