BRISTOL — The city and its police are asking for donations to build a memorial to honor fallen Bristol officers.

The memorial would be built in front of the police station at 131 N. Main St., where members of the community left flowers and notes on a parked police car to honor Lt. Dustin DeMonte and Sgt. Alex Hamzy last year after the officers were <u>fatally shot in an Oct. 12 ambush.</u> It didn't take long for <u>every inch of the cruiser's hood, roof and trunk to be covered.</u>

"The memorial will serve as a permanent reminder of the ultimate sacrifice that was made by the officers named on the wall, as well as a memorial for people to visit and pay their respects to," the police department said in a <u>Facebook post.</u>

The Bristol Police Memorial Committee, through the Bristol Police Benevolent Association, will oversee the memorial, police said, and the Main Street Community Foundation will manage donations. The Bristol Police Memorial Fund will only be used for the creation, construction and future maintenance of the memorial, they said.
