# Main Street Community Foundation Scholarship Program

Main Street Community Foundation's scholarship program brings together students and donors who care about education. The Foundation currently administers over 100 named scholarship funds that have been established by individuals, families, businesses and other organizations. Although each scholarship has unique criteria, all donors seek to assist students in pursuing their education and achieving their goals and dreams. They believe that helping students ease the financial obligations of education is an investment in the future.

**Because of these donors' generosity, the Foundation awarded over \$423,543 in scholarships to 186 students in 2026.** The students – graduating high school seniors, current college students and adult learners – hail from the towns of Bristol, Burlington, Plainville, Plymouth, Southington and Wolcott as well as other communities. They are continuing to pursue their education by attending four-year colleges and universities, community colleges, military academies and vocational/technical schools.

## Volunteer Scholarship Committee

All scholarships are awarded through a blind competitive application process. A volunteer selection committee appointed by the Foundation's Board of Directors evaluates all applications before recommending recipients. # Establishing a Scholarship Fund at Main Street Community Foundation

Scholarship funds at Main Street Community Foundation were established by individuals, families and businesses from all across central Connecticut. While their motivations for establishing the funds vary, they all share one thing – the desire to help students achieve their educational and career goals.

Scholarship funds provide financial assistance to students pursuing educational opportunities in a variety of different areas and at different stages of their academic careers. Moreover, the majority of these funds are endowed, which means that the Foundation can continue to award these scholarships to students forever.

There are two ways you can make a meaningful impact on local students through the Main Street Community Foundation:

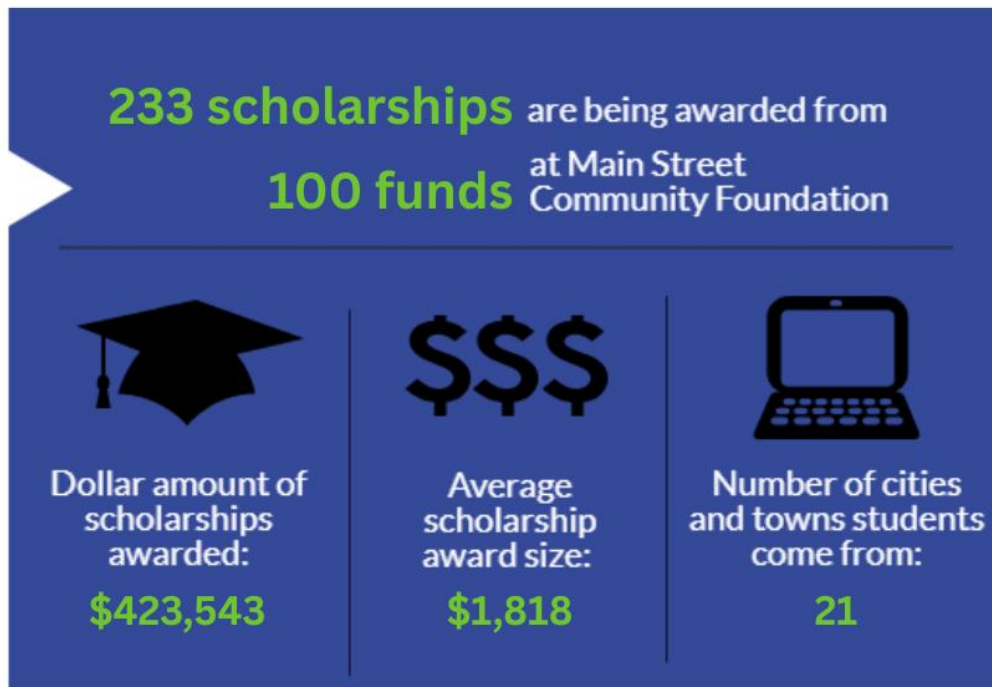
- 1. Establish an individual named fund.**

You can establish a named fund for any level of education. You may designate a particular school, field of study and select eligibility criteria. The fund can be started using a variety of gift giving vehicles, including: cash, stock, retirement assets and other tangible personal property. The minimum donation to establish a scholarship fund is \$25,000. This gift can be given as a lump sum or over a period of time during your life. You may also leave charitable assets upon your passing in the form of a bequest in will or trust, retirement plan designations or beneficiary designation in a life insurance policy.

- 2. Contribute any amount to an already established named fund.**

You can donate any amount at any time to any of the established funds at the Foundation. Each scholarship fund has its own purpose and you can choose which fund to donate based on your passion and the type of student you want to help.

This fund was established in 2025 with a generous donation from John "Jay" Calnan for the purpose of awarding scholarships in memory of his brother Christopher P. Calnan, a young man whose life was defined not by limitations, but by perseverance, passion and heart. Born with a skull defect that required surgical intervention and the placement of protective plates, Christopher was advised against participating in sports. Despite this, he developed a deep love for all sports and the sense of community it brings. Though he could not safely play, he found his place on the ball field as a bat boy for the Bristol Red Sox, where he began to form and continued to form meaningful bonds and experienced the camaraderie and belonging, for several years, that he cherished so deeply. Christopher's life was tragically cut short at the age of 22 in an automobile accident, leaving behind a grieving family and a community that continues to feel his absence. Yet his legacy lives on through this scholarship, which honors his resilience, his love for sports and his unwavering spirit. Scholarships will be awarded annually to graduating seniors needing financial assistance from Bristol Central High School, Bristol Eastern High School or Saint Paul Catholic High School who have earned at least three varsity letters during their secondary school experience while contributing to Bristol's sports heritage.

## **BRISTOL YALE/MILES PECK JENNINGS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

Miles Peck Jennings, Sr. was a longtime Bristol resident who was intelligent, fun-loving and admired in the Bristol area. After attending Bristol public schools and graduating from Deerfield Academy, he graduated from Yale College in 1935. After he passed away suddenly at the young age of 39 in 1951, the Bristol Yale Club established the Miles Peck Jennings Memorial Fund to honor and memorialize him. The Miles Peck Jennings Memorial Fund was transferred to Main Street Community Foundation by the Bristol Yale Club in 2021 and renamed the Bristol Yale/Miles Peck Jennings Memorial Scholarship Fund. This scholarship will be awarded annually to graduating seniors or graduates of public, private or parochial secondary schools located in Bristol, Burlington, Plainville or Plymouth. Students must be pursuing undergraduate or graduate studies at an accredited college or university, with a preference for students attending Yale University or any of Yale University's graduate or professional schools or divisions.
