
A Southington based trust and the foundation overseeing it is looking for nonprofits to benefit from possible grant awards that would improve mental health services in the community. (Shutterstock)

SOUTHINGTON, CT — A regional charitable foundation serving Southington is looking for applicants to tap into grants that would fund mental health initiatives locally.





Main Street Community Foundation in 2004.

Since then, more than \$12 million has been granted from it to improve the health of Southington residents.
