## **UConn returns home to** celebrations, vandalism

STORRS — UConn coach Dan Hurley let the moment envelet the moment envelope him Tuesday on the 40-mile ride from Bradley International Airport back to campus watching the fans who hung signs from highway overpasses and lined the streets leading into Storrs.

More than 7,000 people gathered inside

people gathered inside Gampel Pavilion,

Connecticut's home arena, to greet the team Tuesday afternoon with raucous cheers and standing ovations in a celebration of Monday's win over San Diego State. It was the pro-gram's fifth NCAA title in the last 24 years the most of any program in college basketball.
