Bristol issue needs to be addressed

BRISTOL With homeless outreach advocates saying the number of Connecticut residents becoming unsheltered is reaching unprecedented heights alongside a grow-ing senior demographic, outreach groups across the

state are looking to cre-ate stronger cold weather programs in order to pave a better future for aiding those in need.

"Last year, we had around 27 people out-side [in winter]," said Christine Thebarge, executive director of Bristol's

unsheltered St Vincent De Paul Mission of Bristol.
"As of [mid-December 2023], we had [around 80] people outside.

St. Vincent is part of the Central Connecticut Coordinated Access Network which is often referred to as the Central CAN. CANs are part of a statewide initiative that

seeks to streamline a proseeks to streamline a pro-cess connecting applicants facing homelessness with resources in their commu-

nities. The Central CAN is one of seven others throughout the state and is responsi-ble for services in Bristol, New Britain, Southington, Plainville and Berlin. According to data

encourage sustainability."

Additionally, there are Field of Interest (FOI) funds available in this grant cycle that support the following specific uses:

- Care and support of animals
- Sports field maintenance in Bristol and Burlington
- Programs / projects benefiting the Burlington community
- Non-sport, noncompetitive programs / activities for children attending ele-

mentary and middle schools in Southington.

"Grants from these funds are in addition to numerous other unrestricted and FOI funds," Rajotte explained.

The Main Street Community Foundation's Distribution Committee, a volunteer group of appointed community representatives, recommends all grant decisions for final approval by the Foundation's Board of Directors. Since 1995, when the Foundation was established, more than \$28.2 million has been awarded in grants and scholarships

to improve the local communities.
